



Every Elizabeth Morr piece is hand-crafted with utmost precision and care. We give attention to detail; from the superior materials we use to the final stitch that knits together our masterpiece. Every piece is made by a community of women who give their time and love to create yet another work of art.
- Elizabeth Morr uses an ancient technique of jewelry making, which is exhibited also on how African hair is plaited using yarn. The technique was passed down generations from Lebo's grandmother (maternal) to her mother, which has been passed down to Lebo's daughter.
- Elizabeth Morr brand is named after Lebo's mother, Elizabeth Maureen who was nicknamed Morr (Sis Morr/ Mamma Morr) by those who were close to her. Mamma Morr passed away on 5th June 2004, she was a woman of excellence, a disciplinarian, and very big on giving, a loving wife and a mother of 4 children and 4 grandchildren. Elizabeth Maureen was very neat, her house and her garden were the neatest in the neighborhood, and all her beautiful traits became the DNA of the brand that you see today.

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
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
