Things to know when visiting Gauteng.
















FLYING FROM AND TO GAUTENG



- Make sure your bags and luggage have locks and name tags.
- Do not allow people to tamper with your bags. If your bag is tampered with consult airport security.
- When seeking directions, proceed to the marked information centres only.
- Avoid using random tour operators and/ or unaccredited taxis.



AT THE HOTEL, B&B, GUEST HOUSE AND AIRBNB


- Store valuables in the safety deposit box.
- Keep your room locked.
- Never leave your luggage unattended unless it is locked away in your room.
- If someone knocks on your door, check who it is before opening the door.
- Make sure that luggage is only given to the bell staff and that a receipt is issued.
- It is advisable to keep legal/important documents safely locked in your hotel room. Should you wish to certify a copy of your legal documents, you can have this done at a Police Station, Post Office, Bank or Magistrate Court.





THE ROAD TRIP & TRAVELING IN GAUTENG

- Plan your route in advance.
- Lock valuable items in the boot/trunk before your departure.
- If in doubt about the safety of an area, phone a police station for advice and help.
- Keep the doors always locked and keep the windows up.
- At night, park in safe areas such as petrol/filling stations and or a Police Station.





- Never pick up strangers or hitchhikers.
- Make sure you have the number of the car rental company at hand in case you get stranded.
- Car jamming make sure your vehicle is securely locked before moving away from it.
- Navigators: While navigators are very useful when visiting South Africa, use
 them cautiously. When picking up your rental vehicle, ask the car rental agency
 to advise you on the safest route to your destination. Here, local knowledge is
 power, enquire from the reception desk at your hotel to find out as much as you
 can about the best amenities around and the best times to visit them.
- Road safety: Most of all, ensure to stay on main roads or highways as much as possible. Try not to deviate into poorly lit, informally developed areas.
- When driving in mountainous areas, be sure to look out for flying stones or rocks or objects left on the road intending to stop motorists for criminal purposes.
- Only stop in an area where you feel safe such as a busy shopping centre, or petrol station and/or police station and not on the side of the road if possible.





BEING SAFE ON THE STREETS

- Avoid an ostentatious display of expensive jewellery, cameras, mobile phones and other valuables.
- Always keep your handbag with you, never unattended.

- Carry your wallet in an inside pocket never in the rear pocket of your trousers.
- Credit card transactions must be processed in your presence.
- Do not carry large sums of cash on you.
- At night, stay away from dark, isolated areas and do not explore on your own.
